SISTERS WITH FINAL VOWS RENEW THEIR COMMITMENT TO GOD DURING RETREAT

PJC CELEBRATE HOLY WEEK WITH FAITH AND DEVOTION

Every year, the Poor of Jesus Christ receive special guidance from their Founder, Father Gilson Sobreiro, through a letter called "Nuntio Vobis" (I announce to you). This heartfelt tradition is deeply embraced by every sister and member of the Institute, helping them prepare for Holy Week, which is a meaningful time leading up to Easter. Each day of the week, the sisters follow the Liturgy and engage in thoughtful meditations that draw them into the mystery of Our Lord's Passion. Starting on Palm Sunday, as they remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. On Monday, they spend three hours in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, reflecting and meditating

on of Bethany, who poured perfume on Jesus' feet. On Tuesday, the focus of meditation is on Judas' betrayal, encouraging a moment of reflection during Adoration.

On Wednesday, everyone comes together to think about brotherly love, looking at the stories of Judas and Peter. Then, on Holy Thursday, after the Holy Thursday Mass, there's a community Adoration with the Blessed Sacrament, which is placed in a special urn on the stripped altar. They also have a Vigil of Adoration that goes on until Friday at 3 pm. The quietness carries on until Saturday, when they reflect on Mary's sorrow. After joining in the Easter Vigil, they joyfully celebrate the Resurrection as a community.

The sisters joined in the celebrations of Jesus' Passion, Resurrection Death. and alongside the local Church. "We experienced moments of silence and reflection where we connected with the suffering of Christ and Mary, but also shared in the joy of Mary Magdalene, who was the first to witness his resurrection." the sisters from the Beira mission shared.

ANNUAL RETREAT UNITES PJC SISTERS WITH FINAL VOWS



From April 27 to May 2, the annual retreat for sisters who have taken final vows was held at the Abarés Ranch, nestled in the southern part of São Paulo. It was a time for reflection, listening, and spiritual renewal. This special moment was shared by 23 sisters from various missions in Brazil, Chile, Bolivia, Paraguay, Uruguay, and Peru, who devoted themselves to quiet prayer and encounter with God. The retreat was led by Monsignor Antônio Robson Gonçalves, General and Judicial Vicar of the Diocese of Mogi das Cruzes (SP), with the theme: "Consecrated Religious Life: a pilgrimage that lasts a lifetime, therefore, being with the Master, listening to Him and learning from Him."

This theme encouraged the sisters to renew their closeness with Christ, allowing themselves to be shaped and led by Him in their faithful journey of religious vocation.



These were days filled with listening to the Word, quiet prayer, and sharing a common wish of staying closer to God. "It was a peaceful retreat filled with silence, listening, and sharing, where we were encouraged to take a deeper and more thoughtful look at what the Church teaches about the significance of consecrated life both in the world and within the Church. We reflected on the value of being a visible sign of God in our lives," shared Sister Romana, PJC.

Sister Rafaela, PJC, also shared her thoughts, saying, "Listening to the Church and understanding how it views our Charism, and what it means to be a Poor of Jesus Christ in harmony with the teachings in the Code of Canon Law and other documents, made me feel that our vocation is truly beautiful and bigger than ourselves, which is why we must cherish it."

The Quasimodo tradition is a Chilean religious festival that takes place on the Sunday after Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday). During this special day, a procession happens to bring communion to the sick and elderly who couldn't receive it during the Easter Triduum. This procession, known as "Running to Christ," features "quasi-modistas" riding on horseback or in carriages. They gather at churches to receive blessings before heading out to visit those in need, showcasing a beautiful mix of faith, tradition, and kindness. On April 27, the sisters from the Rancagua mission in Chile took part in this tradition, starting with Holy Mass at the Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and then they went out to deliver communion to the sick in the community, joined by Father Saul.
